At World Rowing, we believe in providing athletes with the best possible platforms to thrive, and the 2026 Championships







Optimal road, rail, water and air connections make Duisburg the ideal place for business, sport and culture. The city at the confluence of the Rhine and the Ruhr is Europe's leading steel location and "Duisport" is the world's largest inland port.

Duisburg is a city with a rich industrial past that has transformed into an attractive travel destination over the past decades. It offers an exciting mix of industrial culture, green recreational areas, cultural highlights.

If you have spare time during your visit in Duisburg there are a few sightseeing sports, we recommend visiting:

Landschaftspark Duisburg-Nord:

This former ironworks has been repurposed into a unique recreational park where you can climb a blast furnace for a breathtaking view over the Ruhr area (free admission, 24h open). You can learn during the day how iron is produced and enjoy at night the former industrial facilities with an impressive light installation.

Tiger & Turtle – Magic Mountain:

A walkable large-scale sculpture in the form of a rollercoaster, situated on a former slag heap on which you can walk along its winding paths and enjoy a breathtaking panoramic view. This sculpture might look familiar to you as it is part of our event logo. Also, this sculpture is particularly magical at night when its integrated LED lights illuminate the structure.




In the immediate vicinity of the regatta course are the 6-Seenplatte (6 Lakes Plateau) and the Duisburg City Forest, which are ideal for a walk or a run, allowing you to exercise away from the water.

In the inner city of Duisburg, the former city harbor (Innenhafen Duisburg, Inner Harbor) is a vibrant district with a unique blend of historic architecture and

modern design. You can find nice restaurants besides offices and residential buildings designed by star architects like Sir Norman Foster.

If you wish to extend your stay, the surrounding cities offer plenty to explore. Highlights include Düsseldorf's charming Old Town, the iconic Cologne Cathedral, Villa Hügel in Essen, and the UNESCO-listed Zeche Zollverein industrial heritage site.

Duisburg is a city worth exploring—a city that celebrates its industrial past while paving the way for a green and culturally diverse future.

TRAVELLING TO DUISBURG

Duisburg is a well-connected city in the heart of the Rhine-Ruhr metropolitan region, making travel to the 2026 World Rowing Under 23 Championships both convenient and efficient. Whether you're arriving by air, rail, or road, here are the key travel options:



By Air – Düsseldorf International Airport (DUS)

Düsseldorf International Airport, Germany's third-largest airport, is located just 25 minutes from Duisburg. It offers excellent connections to major international hubs across Europe, the Americas, Asia, and beyond. From the airport, travelers can reach Duisburg easily by train, taxi, or rental car. Transportation from and to Düsseldorf International Airport is included in the accommodation package.

By Train & Bus – Duisburg Central Station

Duisburg Central Station is one of Germany's major railway hubs. It provides access to:

- Intercity Express (ICE) and Intercity (IC) trains for long-distance travel
- Regional Express (RE) and regional trains for local connections
- Rhine-Ruhr S-Bahn (S-train) services for regional commuting

The station is just a 5-minute drive from the regatta venue and is also served by numerous bus routes connecting Duisburg with other German cities and parts of Eastern Europe. Transportation from and to Duisburg Central Station is included in the accommodation package.

By Car – Motorway Access

Duisburg is easily accessible by car via several major motorways:

- A3 "Wedau" exit and A59 "Sportpark Duisburg" exit are both only 2 minutes from the regatta course
- The A3 and A40 motorways intersect at the Duisburg-Kaiserberg interchange, a key junction linking major east-west and north-south routes, located just five minutes from the regatta venue.
- Breitscheid interchange (10 minutes away) connects to A52, A524, and A3

These connections make Duisburg reachable from all directions, whether you're coming from within Germany or neighboring countries.

Local Access – Duisburg-Schlenk S-Bahn Station

Spectators from the surrounding region can use the S1 S-Bahn line, which stops at Duisburg-Schlenk station. This line offers direct connections to Düsseldorf, Mülheim, Essen, Dortmund, and other cities in the Rhine-Ruhr area.



Visa Information

If you are planning to attend the 2026 World Rowing Under 23 Championships in Germany, please ensure you are informed about the applicable visa requirements.

Germany is part of the Schengen Area. Citizens of Schengen member states do not require a visa for short stays of up to 90 days within a 180-day period.

For visitors from non-Schengen countries, a visa may be necessary. Please verify whether your country has a visa-free agreement with the Schengen Area. If not, you will need to apply for a Schengen visa. The application typically requires:

- A completed visa application form
- A valid passport
- Recent passport-sized photographs
- Proof of accommodation
- Travel insurance
- Evidence of sufficient financial means for your stay

Visa processing times can vary, so it is strongly recommended to apply well in advance of your planned travel. For the most accurate and up-to-date information, consult the German embassy or consulate in your country.



While in Germany, you are required to carry valid identification (passport or national ID), as authorities may request to see it.

- Gender
- Role within the team (e.g., athlete, coach, official)



History of the Duisburg Regatta Course

In 1873, the Krupp company (today ThyssenKrupp AG) bought the site, which is now known as the "Sportpark Duisburg", from the German state. Krupp needed gravel and sand for the construction and operation of its own steel industry. So, in the 1920s, sand and gravel extraction began at the current location of the regatta course. At the beginning of the 1930s, one of the resulting lakes was dredged to create a 2000 m long regatta course. In July 1935, the first rowing regatta was held on the Duisburg regatta course.



The first major international competition was the European Rowing Championships in 1957, which were held there again in 1965. Today's grandstand and a modern and larger regatta house with a finish tower were built for the 1979 Canoe Sprint World Championships. The new facilities were also used four years later for the 1983 World Rowing Championships. The regatta course underwent the next major change in 2006 and 2007 when the warm-up canal was dredged parallel to the regatta course. With the complete modernization of the boat sheds on the east bank in 2018 and the construction of the new regatta building including a new finish tower in 2025, the Duisburg regatta course is one of the most modern regatta courses in the world.



Catering

From 19 July to 26 July 2026, centralized catering for lunch and dinner will be provided at the regatta course in a spacious catering tent, located on the meadow near the entrance to the main regatta offices.

Please note:

- Lunch and dinner will not be served at the hotels.
- Breakfast will be provided at the respective hotels.

The first meal included in the package will be lunch on the day of arrival, and the final meal will be breakfast on the day of departure.

Additional meals (e.g. lunch on departure day) can be booked for 20 € per meal. Those meals can be booked via initial accommodation booking or via www.duisburg2026.com until July 15.

TEAM SERVICES



Transport

A continuous shuttle service will operate between the official hotels and the regatta venue. Buses will run at 20-minute intervals, with each journey taking approximately 20 minutes. The service will be available during the official venue opening hours on both training and competition days. This transportation is free of charge and exclusively available to participants who have booked their accommodation through the Organising Committee.

Team Tents

A designated area for team tents will be provided. The specific location and any necessary registration process will be announced in early 2026.

Team Parking

Parking for tour buses will be available next to the nearby soccer stadium "Schauinsland-Reisen-Arena" (500m distance). Parking for team cars will be available to a limited amount next to the street "Kruppstraße". Further information on team parking will be published in early 2026.



Medical Insurance Requirement

All participants in the 2026 World Rowing Under 23 Championships are required to obtain medical insurance coverage in their home country prior to the event. This insurance must cover any costs beyond standard first aid, ambulance services, and physiotherapy provided at the venue.

Please note: The Organising Committee will not assume responsibility for any expenses related to hospital or dental treatment. These costs must be covered by the participant's personal medical insurance policy.

Medical Support & Emergency Services

A fully equipped First Aid station will be available within the athletes' area, staffed by an experienced regatta physician and a qualified team of medical professionals to handle emergency situations.

The municipal hospital of Duisburg is located approximately 2 km west of the regatta course. During the event, an ambulance and emergency response unit will be stationed on-site, with an estimated response time of just 3 minutes to the hospital.

The Organising Committee will coordinate with the hospital in advance of the 2026 World Rowing Under 23 Championships to ensure they are fully informed of the event schedule and prepared to provide support if needed.


